Dear Faculty Colleagues,

Welcome—or welcome back—to CU Denver. Lecturers are an essential part of our academic community. Of the approximately 1,050 faculty at CU Denver, nearly 450 are Lecturers. Your growing presence highlights the vital role you play in advancing the university's educational mission.

The University of Colorado Denver Association of Lecturers and Instructors (UCDALI) continues to be a strong advocate for Lecturer support and equity. In partnership with UCDALI and campus leaders, CU Denver has taken steps to improve working conditions, including compensation for courses canceled within two weeks of the semester start, the adoption of inclusive language that recognizes all faculty—not just rostered faculty—and the IRC Faculty Professional Development Fund, which is open to Lecturers.

Another important development last year was Provost guidance to all schools and colleges to implement the Senior Lecturer title and set a minimum pay of \$5,000 per course for Lecturers, with higher rates for Senior Lecturers. These efforts reflect our broader aspiration: to foster an inclusive community at CU Denver where belonging, meaning work, and public service support the flourishing of all. Our students cannot thrive without your success.

Despite these efforts, we recognize that challenges remain, including institutional biases, time constraints, and job insecurity. The Office of Faculty Affairs is committed to working closely with UCDALI and academic units to address these barriers and foster a more inclusive and supportive environment.

Thank you for choosing CU Denver as the place to share your talents, skills, and labor. We are deeply grateful, and we are committed to supporting you in your professional journey.

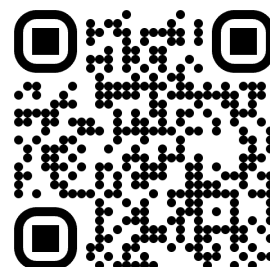
